

SGAC Events

Every year SGAC holds events and conferences to bring together members of the SGAC community to interact with each other and current space sector leaders. The Space Generation Congress (SGC) is held annually in conjunction with the International Astronautical Congress (IAC). The international nature of SGC brings together top young minds from around the world to take part in focused discussions on key space topics. The Space Generation Fusion Forum (SGFF) is SGAC's main U.S. event, similarly held in conjunction with the Space Symposium (SS), and provides a platform for established and up-and-coming young space professionals to network.

SGAC Projects

One of SGAC's key contributions to space policy is through the outputs from year-round projects, working on publications, documentaries, presentations and in producing outreach material. Current projects include:

United Nations Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space (UN COPUOS)

SGAC has Permanent Observer status in UN COPUOS and regularly takes part in the annual meeting, as well as its Legal and Scientific and Technical Subcommittees.

United Nations Office for Outer Space Affairs (UNOOSA)

SGAC works together with UNOOSA in promoting UN workshops and activities and in supporting SGAC members to attend space conferences around the world.
